Attached is the suggested draft of your letter to John Barron. I made it just as short as I could without leaving out the essential thoughts we are attempting to convey to him.


I suggest you do not pull your punches with him since very obviously he is accusing you of having influenced his engineering findings even contrary to good engineering practice. I think I have given him enough drubbing to make him sit up and realize that whatever errors have been made are his, not yours.

So that Barron will not suspect that I prepared the letter and because he may recognize my style, maybe it might be wise for you to redraft it in your own words. This should not be difficult if you follow the sense of my letter carefully.

Use your own judgment but I suggest you bear down on him to get up here quickly and make these tests so that we can go ahead. The Commission will not take these delays into consideration for delaying the project because our engineering should have been perfect when the application was submitted.

I will start Monday morning in the Heldebergs in search of a prospective site as agreed. Meantime, Barron should get busy without delay.
