Dear Mr. Barron:

Thank you for your letter of September 12th.

You perhaps knew that we have had on order for some time with General Electric a 3 KW PM transmitter with a 6-bay antenna. Hence, all that we will have to do to meet the conditions of the ammended application will be to cancel the 6-bay and order the 4-bay antenna.

I was glad to know that we can use the 4-bay General Electric FM antenna mast mounted exactly the same as W G F M's - on the ground without the necessity for any tower or supporting structure other than a base-plate. I de not have the exact elevation of our proposed site but judge it to be 10-15 ft. plur or minus from that of WGPM. If you must have it more accurately then I suggest we have it measured with instruments. Unless I hear from you to the contrary I will assume this will not be necessary.

I am still without your thoughts about a stand-by programming service such as an S-T radio relay link as an auxiliary to our proposed 15,000 cycle hi-fidelity wire-line circuit to be built by the telephone company. I commented on it in my letter of August 20th.
